

NOTICE TO CITIZENS OF RICHLAND COUNTY: Pursuant to the South Carolina Eminent Domain Procedure Act, Section 28-2-70(c), Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1976, as amended, notice is hereby given that entry by personnel of and contracted by Richland County Government will be made in the area of the neighborhoods and roadways described below for such purposes as topographic surveys, subsurface exploration, environmental related studies and for the gathering of any other data necessary for the planning, design, property acquisition, and construction of the neighborhood improvements and bicycle and pedestrian accommodations projects. Additional rights of way and/or easements may be needed to construct these projects.

The proposed projects are:

- Decker Boulevard Neighborhood: This proposed project involves streetscape improvements to include limited undergrounding of utilities, intersection improvements, bike/pedestrian accommodations and pedestrian connectors. The project is located along Decker Boulevard in the Woodfield Park Neighborhood area. The area is roughly bounded by Percival Road, I-77, and Fort Jackson to the south and east; Forest Acres and the Trenholm Road to the west; and Two Notch Road to the north.
- Candlewood Neighborhood: This proposed neighborhood improvement project includes sidewalks (5'-0"), speed humps, stamped asphalt crosswalks, and streetscaping. The project area is bordered by North Springs Road to the east, Crane Creek to the north, North Brick Yard Road to the south and Hardscrabble Road to the west.
- Percival Road Sidewalk: The proposed improvements consists of constructing new concrete curb and gutter (2'-0") and sidewalk (5'-0") along the western (southbound) side of Percival Road, from Forest Drive to Overcreek Road, for a distance of approximately 1.20 miles.
- Fort Jackson Boulevard Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodations: The proposed project includes constructing bicycle and pedestrian accommodations from North King's Grant

Drive to Crowson Road. The proposed improvements may include shared-use paths, striped bicycle lanes and/or sidewalks.

- Clemson Road Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodations: The proposed project includes constructing bicycle and pedestrian accommodations from Old Clemson Road to Promenade Place. The proposed improvements may include shared-use paths, striped bicycle lanes and/or sidewalks.
